GREENWOOD COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING MAY 8, 2023

Chairman Roy Ballard called the regular meeting of the Greenwood County Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. Other members present were Ben Fox, Paul Hodge, Preston Evenson, Malcolm Obourn, County Counselor Paul Dean and County Clerk Kathy Robison.

Commissioners led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Fox moved to approve May 1st, 2023 Minutes as written. Obourn seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Road and Bridge Report:

- Crews have placed two tinhorns one near T Road and 320th and one near T Road and 330th
- Chrisman has received a quote from Drew Ramsey in the amount of \$28,080 for repairs needed north of F Road; it was also noted that an additional \$10,560 would be needed for tinhorns.
- Chrisman would like to order culverts in the estimated amount of \$13,265

Fox moved to approve the purchase of culverts in the amount of \$13,265. Evenson seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

 Wildlife and Parks would like to assume responsibility for 80th Street and parts of W and V Roads; following a brief discussion, County Counselor Paul Dean would like an agreement sent to him to look over the matter further.

Evenson moved to approve special payables in the amount of \$13,188.42. Fox seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Greenwood County resident Tony Gardner attended the meeting to ask commissioners to waive the tipping fee a building located at 810 N. Main.

Fox moved to approve waiving tipping fees for the building located at 810 N. Main. Evenson seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Greenwood County resident Tina Kastning attended the meeting to discuss obtaining receipts that the Sheriff's Office has taken possession of due to an ongoing investigation. County Counselor Paul Dean will speak with the Sheriff's Office regarding the matter. Kastning requested a deputy attend the Salt Springs Township meeting this week.

Slat Springs Township resident Della Lind inquired about a culvert laying near 40th and 50th Roads and would like to know the plan with said culvert. Greenwood County has no input on the matter, as the culvert belongs to the Township.

Ballard moved to approve a five-minute executive session regarding fencing. Fox seconded. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting to reconvene at 9:50 a.m. No decisions were made.

Fox moved to adjourn at 9:53 a.m. Evenson seconded, Motion carried 5-0.
